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WELCOME...

Welcome to The Hundredth Hill! We're thrilled to be the location for Constellation's debut project, *The Grown-Ups*!

As an Artist Residence & Retreat, our mission is to provide incubation space for artists of all genres, and we've enjoyed the steady stream of theatrical residencies we've hosted since our launch in Summer of 2020. Plays that have gotten a start here have made their way to The Walnut Street Theater in Philadelphia and The Atlantic Theatre in New York.

This summer we hosted *The Wire's* Andre Royo workshopping a revisioning of Eric Bogosian's *Talk Radio*, as well as hosting the inaugural Toby Strout Residency, which featured Jen Poe, a young adult fiction author writing autobiographically-based work in response to interpersonal violence. With a primary focus on Indiana Arts and Artists, we've hosted many Hoosier authors, musicians, poets, and doctoral students, as well as photographers, painters, sculptors, and dancers.

Our 50-acre retreat features four guest residences, a commercial recording studio, an outdoor stage, a performance barn, and a mile of trails to hike. Our relationship with Constellation stems from our long-standing relationships with its Directors – Chad Rabinovitz of the BPP, Kate Galvin & Gabe Gloden of Cardinal Stage, and John Armstrong of Pigasus. We're delighted to see these powerhouses join forces in this amazing new Constellation venture, and are so glad to welcome all of you to The Hundredth Hill! Enjoy the show.

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


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A NOTE FROM THE CREATORS

To us, the most exciting thing about theater is the dangerous and beautiful potential of gathering a bunch of strangers in a room. Nightdrive makes plays that push the limits of what those strangers can make happen together. We love to push our own creative limits, too, borrowing from genres and gatherings that have nothing to do with theater: focus groups, football games, alien movies. We start every play as very experienced beginners. The only constant has been that room full of strangers.

Then, those rooms went away.

When the pandemic hit, we were honestly pretty skeptical about whether we should even try to make theater at all, rather than just waiting it out. But in the spring of 2021, as everyone was getting vaccinated and the world was tentatively opening up again, we started to wonder if we could find a way for the restrictions of a Covid world to make a show actually feel more special than it would without them.

Eventually, we got the idea of telling a story around a campfire in our backyard. With the cast and audience all sitting together, drinking beer and roasting marshmallows, it felt like the kind of gathering we hadn't been able to have for forever. It felt nostalgic. And that nostalgia made room for danger and discomfort to enter a story in surprising ways. There was something elemental about it, too: Isn't this how theater came to be? Sitting around a fire and telling a story?

We were totally overwhelmed by the response to this little show we put up in our yard, and we're so grateful for the opportunity to be able to bring it back and share it with even more audiences this summer. We're excited to bring Nightdrive's work outside of New York for the first time. We're also looking forward to collaborating with Constellation further on a film adaptation. We're excited to be beginners yet again.

Mostly, we're excited you're the strangers in the room tonight.



Nightdrive makes rigorously irreverent, demandingly vulnerable, borderline-impossible plays that use indelible moments of stagecraft to build thrillingly personal relationships with audiences, empowering them to reimagine themselves and what they're capable of. Dispatching new, surprising ways of telling stories that we create in our hyper-collaborative playmaking process, Nightdrive chauffeurs our artists and audiences through the darkness of the world outside, the quiet horror of sharing their tenderness, and the clandestine rush of taking risks together anyway, practicing the collective compassion and boldness it will take to make a more profoundly imaginative world together in the morning.

The co-artistic directors of Nightdrive are director/ writer/designer Skylar Fox and writer/performer Simon Henriques.


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








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CREATIVE TEAM

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
PROJECT CONSTELLATION

Project Constellation (formerly Project Pigasus) is a state-wide high school screenwriting competition sponsored by Indiana based film company Pigasus Pictures. Indiana students grades 9-12 submit short screenplays, a winner is chosen, and Pigasus brings a professional film crew to the winner's town to fully produce their movie!
